Whg Community Rooms.....The future!

Why have an extensive network of Community Rooms across the borough that have been used and continue to be used by a large number of our member Tenant & Resident groups. Our members are responsible for looking after these rooms on a daily basis and in many cases are key holders.

Since the transfer of the housing stock from Walsall Council over 10 years ago, investment in these Community Rooms has been rather patchy and has been based more around Health & Safety, rather than making the rooms 'fit for purpose'

Why commissioned an independent assessment of these facilities last year and the findings have now triggered an initial investment of around £100k to start the process of refurbishing their Community Rooms. There were many key recommendations contained within the somewhat classified Community Rooms Report, which will need a great deal of work and time to implement.

WTRF has a number of member organisations that operate from the extensive network of whg's Community Rooms from across the borough. The membership of WTRF took the decision at the last quarterly 'Tenant Network Meeting' to elect a panel of service users from across the borough (2 from each trust area) to meet with whg to assist them in the Regeneration of their Community Rooms.

The panel will need to develop its vision in partnership with whg and work towards 'Real Community Involvement' at the cole face of our neighbourhoods and Communities.

Regular updates will be included in our newsletter, to keep you all in the loop as to what exciting developments are coming up in and around why's Community Rooms.

Community First funding



What is Community First Funding?

Community First Neighbourhood Matched Fund is an initiative that provides local communities with the means to address their own priorities.

Panels have been set up for 10 local areas which will look at projects within the area and then decide which ones to submit to the Community Development Foundation for approval. To view the panel members, please click on your relevant local area below.

It is a matched fund programme, which means that every £1 provided in funding by the Community Development Foundation must be matched by a similar amount of in-kind donations from elsewhere. These can be donations of cash, services, free productions or volunteer time. Funding is allocated to have an impact on the local priorities as agreed by the Panel

What funding is available?

Funding has been allocated at ward level across every local authority in England. Eligible wards were selected on the basis of high levels of deprivation and significant increases in benefits claimants.

Groups can apply for between £250 and £2,500 for a one year period; you can reapply each year.

Who can apply?

To apply for finding you must:

- be a not-for-profit, third sector voluntary or community group (this funding is not available for individuals)
- be connected with and/or meeting the needs of the local community
- have a bank account with two signatories OR nominate an organisation which has a bank account with two signatories to hold fund on your behalf
- provide adequate and relevant insurance documents for your project
- show how the project is in line with the priorities identified for the ward

have a governing document that has as a minimum the name, aim/purpose, objects, a dissolution clause for the organisation, a list of trustees/committee members and signatures. New groups are required to be working towards this.



Basic computer skills training




WTRF hosts Friday morning computer and internet training, in a relaxed setting.

Major £50 million plans to regenerate estate in Walsall with new 412-home development revealed

Major £50 million plans to regenerate an area of Walsall have been revealed to the public for the first time.

Housing provider whg showcased the plans for a 412-homeschemein the Goscote area of Blakenall at an engagement event attended by more than 250 people.

The housing provider is partnering with national housing and regeneration company Keepmoat on what will be the most significant development project it has ever undertaken. It would see a total of 412 homes built with 177 for affordable rent and 235 for sale in the Goscote area, which includes Shakespeare Crescent, Keats Road and Chaucer Road.

The plans are subject to planning permission and a funding bid to the Homes and Communities Agency. Should both be successful work would begin at the site in October 2014 with completion of the entire scheme due in 2018.

Carole Wildman, Director of Regeneration and Development at why said: "We are delighted to showcase our detailed plans to transform this area of Blakenall.

"The completed scheme would see a total regeneration of the area with a mix new homes for both rent and sale. Our vision goes way beyond simply building homes, this will be a holistic regeneration with a focus on community engagement. We want to invest in and transform this area to create a cohesive community.

"We are delighted to be partnering with Keepmoat on this scheme, which will create jobs and apprenticeships alongside much-needed housing supply for local people."

Martyn Johnson, Partnerships Project Manager at Keepmoat in the Midlands, said: "Building hundreds of high-quality new homes will help breathe new life into Goscote and regenerate this part of Walsall. The plan for Goscote is to build highly aspirational affordable homes for private sale and rent, helping families onto the housing ladder, creating an exciting, mixed-tenure community.

"We are pleased to be partnering with whg on such a major project and it is testament to the great work we have been doing building more than 1,000 high-quality new homes in the Midlands over the past three years."

Older residents in Walsall came together for a ballroom-themed event encouraging people to love thy neighbour.

The Strictly Tea with whg event was held by the housing provider at the Goldmine Centre in the town for older residents living in its properties. It coincided with European Neighbours' Day.

More than 80 people attended the event, which had a 40s theme and featured everything from ballroom-dancing and singing to armchair exercising and information stands on services for older people.

Darlaston-based Jean Wright, who attended the event said: "This was a fantastic event with some wonderful entertainment.

"It was a great chance for older residents to come together and spend time with one another which is extremely important to maintain a sense of community and to reduce social isolation."

There was also a Good Neighbour Award ceremony for those who have gone the extra mile throughout the year.

Connie Jennings, regeneration programme manager at whg, said: "This was a fantastic event and it was great to see so many people come along. "The day was about involving our older customers and recognising European Neighbours' Day by showing that getting to know your neighbours and spending time with them can help everyone, particularly older residents.

"We want to ensure communities in Walsall are sustainable so it is very important to us that we help bring people together and reduce problems like social isolation."
